ADULTS AT RISK

What are Adults-at-Risk?

When a person 60 years and older or is disabled and is subjected to physical abuse, material abuse, and neglect or self-neglect as defined below:

Physical Abuse is the willful infliction of physical pain, injury or unreasonable confinement. It includes, but is not limited to, beating, choking, burning, inappropriate medication, tying, locking a person up sexual assault.

Material or Financial Exploitation is the misuse of an elder's money or property. It includes deception, diverting income, mismanagement of funds and taking money or possession against a person's will.

Neglect occurs when a caregiver's failure to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, medical or dental care results in significant danger to the physical or mental health of an older person in their care.

Self-Neglect occurs when an older person's physical or mental health is endangered by their own inability to provide adequate food, shelter, clothing, medical or dental care.

- PURPOSE:** The mission of the Calumet County Public Health Department is to promote conditions in Calumet County in which people can be healthy. The public health department provides professional nurse consultation and skilled nursing care to county residents at home, in the community, or in the schools. Public health nurses offer home visits for consultation, health care supervision, assessment, and education. Education topics include but are not limited to prenatal care coordination, newborn visits with water sampling as needed, parenting, growth and development, Values and Choices classes and blood borne pathogen training. Fluoride programs offered in area schools. School screenings for vision, hearing, and scoliosis are provided. Immunization clinics include routine immunizations as well as flu clinics; lead screening, car seat checks, communicable disease investigation and blood pressure screening are also provided. These services can be provided in a client's home, school, or in the office at the Courthouse. A WIC (Woman, Infants and Children) office is affiliated with the department to provide nutrition education, financial assistance for food and health care referrals.
- COST:** There is no charge for public health services. Donations are accepted for most immunizations.

PURPOSE: Family Care Partnership, also known as Partnership, is an innovative program that provides a full range of long-term care, health and medical services, and prescription drugs to enable you to live as independently as possible.

Partnership also covers your health and medical services, which includes the services of a physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, or other qualified medical professional. Health promotion, disease prevention, health maintenance, and patient education are also provided. In addition, Medicaid and Medicare drug services are all provided by the Family Care Partnership organization. Members do not need to have a separate Medicare Part D drug plan.

The goal is to provide a variety of services so seniors & adults with physical and/or developmental disabilities can live at home as long as possible.

FAMILY CARE PROGRAM

Family care is a public program that offers individuals a wide variety of long-term care services, making it possible for seniors and adults with physical and developmental disabilities to live at home and stay independent as long as possible. Services include:

- Personal Care
- Homemaking & chore service
- Occupational & Physical therapy (except during inpatient stay)
- Home delivered meals
- Specialized equipment
- All Medicaid-funded, long-term services

Family Care members receive support from a Care Management Team made up of a care manager and nurse. They perform a comprehensive assessment of your needs, abilities, preferences, and values to develop a personalized plan to meet your outcomes and goals.

Members continue to choose their own physicians while Family Care provides the added long-term care support you need. Your team may make suggestions and assist in coordination, but you and your doctor will continue to be responsible for managing your health and medical care decisions.

The Family Care program can help if you:

- Have long-term care needs expected to last more than 90 days; and
- Have a physical or developmental disability; and
- Are at least 65-year-old, or are at least 18 years old with a physical or developmental disability; and
- Are Medicaid eligible.

IRIS PROGRAM

PURPOSE: IRIS is a program that allows you to direct your own services and supports. IRIS recognizes that you are the decision-maker in your life, including determining your daily activities and the types of support or assistance you need to meet your long-term care needs. IRIS is grounded in the core values of self-determination. These values include:

- Freedom to decide how you want to live your life;
- Authority over a specific budget;
- Support to organize resources in ways that are life enhancing and meaningful to you;
- Responsibility for the wise use of public funds and recognition of the contribution you make to your community; and
- Confirmation of the important role of self-advocates.

IRIS can be an option for you if:

- You have long-term care needs expected to last longer than 90 days; and
- You have a physical or developmental disability
- You are at least 18 years old
- You are Medicaid eligible

PURPOSE:

1. A national retirement income supplement available to nine out of ten Americans over 65 years of age (persons aged 62 may qualify under certain conditions). Monthly benefits are available to workers upon retirement, to their dependents and/or survivors, and to the severely disabled.
2. To provide health insurance through Medicare for partial payment of hospital, post-hospital, and other medical expenses.

MEDICARE is a Federal health insurance program, which helps defray many of the medical expenses of most Americans over the age of 65. Persons eligible for Social Security may also apply for Medicare benefits.

Older persons should apply for Medicare benefits three months prior to the 65th birthday. Working persons over 65 are entitled to Medicare even though they do not apply for Social Security.

Medicare has two parts:

PART A -- HOSPITAL INSURANCE

Medicare Part A helps pay the cost of inpatient hospital care, in some instances, and under certain conditions, Part A helps pay for inpatient care in a skilled nursing facility, home health care and hospice care.

PART B -- MEDICAL INSURANCE

Part B helps pay for medically necessary doctors' services, outpatient hospital services and some other medical services. Enrollees must pay a monthly premium for Part B.

Medicare will pay for many health care services but not all of them. Medicare does not cover custodial care or care that is not determined to be reasonable and necessary for the diagnosis or treatment of an illness or injury.

It is possible to privately purchase supplemental health insurance. This is sometimes referred to as "Medigap". Before purchasing a policy, care should be taken to assure that the plan provides the coverage that the older person wants and needs.

3. **SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI)** assures a minimum monthly income to needy persons with limited income and resources, who are 65, blind or disabled. Eligibility is based on income and assets.

Obtaining an accurate diagnosis of a dementing disorder is often the most important first step made by patients and families in their effort to secure the education and support needed to cope with Alzheimer's disease. Diagnostic clinics provide evaluation and management services to patients and their families. A typical patient will undergo neuropsychological testing, a comprehensive history and physical examination and, if appropriate, laboratory and x-ray testing during the initial evaluation. The involvement of a social worker is a routine and essential feature.
